The Lake Expedition will be a three-day experience at Crimson lake and is based on curriculum and outdoor skills. Following is a brief schedule:

**Wednesday, October 4—Canoe on Lake and Visit the local historic site.**

**Thursday, October 5—final activities and leave for home by 11:00am**

Please see the equipment list included. You will need to come prepared with the items on the list.

The cost for the Lake Expedition is \$50 per student, and includes the use of equipment, educational materials and camping and tour fees. The school is responsible for transportation and each student or group of students is responsible for their food. You may collaborate with your classmates to figure out menus and/or camping gear such as a tent.

Camping requires equipment such as a tent and stove. There is no need to buy all of this equipment; much of it can be borrowed from people in your area that may be involved in outdoor activities.

When you have decided to attend, fill in the enclosed Registration/Permission and Medical Form as well as the liability form and return it to your teacher with your \$50.

The Lake Expedition staff are carefully selected and has expertise and experience in the activities in which they will lead.
